



**Wrongful Conviction Documentary Featured in Iowa City Film Festival August 27 & 28**

The Innocence Project of Iowa is pleased to learn that the documentary *\$100 a Day* has been named as an official selection of the 2010 Landlocked Film Festival in Iowa City. The film chronicles the story of a San Francisco area man, Rick Walker, who spent 12 years in prison for a murder he did not commit, and his struggle to receive the compensation to which he was legally entitled once his innocence was proven. The documentary is scheduled to be shown on Friday, August 27, as part of the 6:30 p.m. screening series in the Carver Room at the Sheraton Hotel, and again during the 5:15 p.m. series on Saturday in the Plaza Room at Hotel Vetro.
